With donations well in excess of two million dollars since its creation, the Jennings Memorial Foundation has provided our community with a new fire truck, assisted in park development efforts, the relocation of the historic Montrose Depot, as well as numerous school projects and scholarships that are awarded each year. In addition, the Montrose community is further enriched by the Jennings Memorial Library and the Montrose Area Historical and Telephone Pioneer Museum.
