Good Evening,

Tonight the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services announced a “Pause to Save Lives” order that will span from November 18th to December 8th. During this time period, a number of restrictions will be in place including in-person learning in high schools, colleges, universities, and the participation of extra-curricular activities and athletics in-person for any grades.

All students will attend school on November 16th and 17th. Students in grades 8-12 will use this time with their teachers to receive additional guidance on using our remote learning platforms and to gather any materials necessary to attend school remotely starting Wednesday, November 18th.

As noted by Director Robert Gordon of the MDHHS, this is a targeted and temporary order, which is why our elementary and middle schools will remain open at this time.

We will continue to carefully implement the established safety protocols in the elementary and middle school to ensure we are doing our part to mitigate spread in the school setting. To date, we have experienced one positive COVID -19 case in grades Pre-K through 7. While we know this can change in an instant, the data currently supports face-to-face instruction in these grades.

Over the next 24 hours, we will be working to address some of the details necessary to meet the guidelines that come with this latest order.
